COPYRIGHT TRANSFER

1. The undersigned hereby assigns to The Institute of Electrical and Electronics Engineers, Incorporated (the “USS”) all rights under copyright that may exist in and to: (a) the above Work, including any revised or expanded derivative works submitted to the USS by the undersigned based on the Work; and (b) any associated written or multimedia components or other enhancements accompanying the Work.

CONSENT AND RELEASE

2. In the event the undersigned makes a presentation based upon the Work at a conference hosted or sponsored in whole or in part by the USS, the undersigned, in consideration for his/her participation in the conference, hereby grants the USS the unlimited, worldwide, irrevocable permission to use, distribute, publish, license, exhibit, record, digitize, broadcast, reproduce and archive, in any format or medium, whether now known or hereafter developed: (a) his/her presentation and comments at the conference; (b) any written materials or multimedia files used in connection with his/her presentation; and (c) any recorded interviews of him/her (collectively, the “Presentation”). RETAINED RIGHTS/TERMS AND CONDITIONS

General

1. Authors/employers retain all proprietary rights in any process, procedure, or article of manufacture described in the Work.
2. Authors/employers may reproduce or authorize others to reproduce the Work, material extracted verbatim from the Work, or derivative works for the author's personal use or for company use, provided that the source and the USS copyright notice are indicated, the copies are not used in any way that implies USS endorsement of a product or service of any employer, and the copies themselves are not offered for sale.
3. In the case of a Work performed under a U.S. Government contract or grant, the USS recognizes that the U.S. Government has royalty-free permission to reproduce all or portions of the Work, and to authorize others to do so, for official U.S. Government purposes only, if the contract/grant so requires.
4. Although authors are permitted to re-use all or portions of the Work in other works, this does not include granting third-party requests for reprinting, republishing, or other types of re-use. The USS Intellectual Property Rights office must handle all such third-party requests.

7. **Classroom or Internal Training Use.** An author is expressly permitted to post any portion of the accepted version of his/her own USS-copyrighted articles on the author's personal web site or the servers of the author's institution or company in connection with the author's teaching, training, or work responsibilities, provided that the appropriate copyright, credit, and reuse notices appear prominently with the posted material. 8. **Electronic Preprints.** Before submitting an article to an USS publication, authors frequently post their manuscripts to their own web site, their employer's site, or to another server that invites constructive comment from colleagues. Upon submission of an article to USS, an author is required to transfer copyright in the article to USS, and the author must update any previously posted version of the article with a prominently displayed USS copyright notice. Upon publication of an article by the USS, the author must replace any previously posted electronic versions of the article with either (1) the full citation to the USS work with a Digital Object Identifier (DOI) or link to the article abstract in USS Digital Library, or (2) the accepted version only (not the USS-published version), including the USS copyright notice and full citation, with a link to the final, published article in USS Digital Library.

INFORMATION FOR AUTHORS

Author Responsibilities

The USS distributes its technical publications throughout the world and wants to ensure that the material submitted to its publications is properly available to the readership of those publications. Authors must ensure that their Work meets the requirements including provisions covering originality, authorship, author responsibilities and author misconduct.
